SCHOLAR ADMISSIONS CRITERIA

1. Recommendations from Middle School Principal with ISEE/HSPT/SSAT (High School Placement Test) results for 9th grade applicants or recommendation from a High School counselor for 10th and 11th grade applicants.
2. Commitment to the rigor of Honors and Advanced Placement courses.
3. Maintenance of GPA 3.5 and above for each semester.
4. Sustained commitment to academic excellence in courses, seminars, labs, group projects, field trips and study groups which are an integral part of the program.
5. The four-year scholarship is renewable annually based on maintenance of distinctive academic progress.
6. If participants leave the program, they will automatically enroll in regular college prep courses and approved Advanced Placement courses. Students will lose the scholarship for the following semester.

CURRICULUM:

9th: English (H); World History I (H); Biology (H); Geometry (H); Spanish I (H); Arts/Tech

10th: English (H); AP World History; AP Biology; Algebra II/Trig (H); Spanish II (H); Arts/Tech

11th: AP English Comp; AP US History; AP Chemistry; Precalculus (H); Spanish III (H); Arts/Tech

12th: AP English Lit; AP Econ/AP Gov; AP Physics; AP Calculus; AP Spanish or AP Chinese; Arts/Tech

The following ELECTIVES may replace AP courses:

- AP Statistics
- AP Environmental Science
- AP Psychology
